Section 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin. Wash

immediately with plenty of soap and water.



HOW TO USE



Pre-clean disassembled endoscope in warm water and proteolytic enzyme cleaner. Wash the outside with disposable sponges or swabs and brush the distal end with a small brush.



Use two 25ml bottle doses in 1 litre of water (1 part Medistel in 20 parts water).



Immerse the instrument in the solution for 10 minutes and rinse thoroughly.

Note: Replace working/mixed solution after 14 days or prior as indicated by the test kit. Dispose of solution if it becomes cloudy or contaminated.
